EACH TYPE OF DEFICIT CAN PROVIDE INSIGHTS INTO DIFFERENT ASPECTS OF AN ECONOMY'S PERFORMANCE AND STABILITY. FOR INSTANCE, WHILE A TRADE DEFICIT MAY SIGNAL A STRONG DOMESTIC DEMAND FOR FOREIGN GOODS, A PERSISTENT BUDGET DEFICIT COULD RAISE CONCERNS ABOUT A GOVERNMENT'S FISCAL RESPONSIBILITY AND LONG-TERM ECONOMIC VIABILITY.
