INTRODUCTION TO EQUILIBRIUM PRICE

UNDERSTANDING SUPPLY AND DEMAND

SUPPLY REFERS TO THE QUANTITY OF A GOOD OR SERVICE THAT PRODUCERS ARE WILLING AND ABLE TO SELL AT VARIOUS PRICES, WHILE DEMAND REPRESENTS THE QUANTITY THAT CONSUMERS ARE WILLING AND ABLE TO PURCHASE AT THOSE SAME PRICES.

THE LAW OF DEMAND

THE LAW OF DEMAND STATES THAT, ALL ELSE BEING EQUAL, AS THE PRICE OF A GOOD DECREASES, THE QUANTITY DEMANDED BY CONSUMERS INCREASES, AND VICE VERSA. THIS INVERSE RELATIONSHIP CAN BE ILLUSTRATED THROUGH A DEMAND CURVE, WHICH

TYPICALLY SLOPES DOWNWARD FROM LEFT TO RIGHT. KEY FACTORS INFLUENCING DEMAND INCLUDE:

- CONSUMER PREFERENCES
- INCOME LEVELS
- PRICE OF RELATED GOODS
- EXPECTATIONS ABOUT FUTURE PRICES

THE LAW OF SUPPLY

CONVERSELY, THE LAW OF SUPPLY STATES THAT, ALL ELSE BEING EQUAL, AS THE PRICE OF A GOOD INCREASES, THE QUANTITY SUPPLIED BY PRODUCERS ALSO INCREASES, LEADING TO A DIRECT RELATIONSHIP. THE SUPPLY CURVE GENERALLY SLOPES UPWARD FROM LEFT TO RIGHT. FACTORS AFFECTING SUPPLY INCLUDE:

- PRODUCTION COSTS
- TECHNOLOGY ADVANCEMENTS
- NUMBER OF SUPPLIERS
- EXPECTATIONS ABOUT FUTURE PRICES

STEPS TO CALCULATE EQUILIBRIUM PRICE

CALCULATING THE EQUILIBRIUM PRICE INVOLVES ANALYZING THE SUPPLY AND DEMAND EQUATIONS TO FIND THE PRICE AT WHICH THEY INTERSECT. THIS PROCESS CAN BE SUMMARIZED IN A SERIES OF STRAIGHTFORWARD STEPS.

STEP 1: DETERMINE THE DEMAND EQUATION

THE DEMAND EQUATION CAN OFTEN BE EXPRESSED IN THE FORM OF A LINEAR EQUATION SUCH AS $Q_D = A - BP$, WHERE Q_D IS THE QUANTITY DEMANDED, P IS THE PRICE, AND A AND B ARE CONSTANTS. FOR EXAMPLE, IF THE DEMAND EQUATION IS $Q_D = 100 - 2P$, IT INDICATES THAT FOR EVERY INCREASE OF ONE UNIT IN PRICE, THE QUANTITY DEMANDED DECREASES BY TWO UNITS.

STEP 2: DETERMINE THE SUPPLY EQUATION

SIMILARLY, THE SUPPLY EQUATION IS USUALLY EXPRESSED AS $Q_S = C + DP$, WHERE Q_S IS THE QUANTITY SUPPLIED, AND C AND D ARE CONSTANTS. FOR INSTANCE, IF THE SUPPLY EQUATION IS $Q_S = 20 + 3P$, THIS MEANS FOR EVERY UNIT INCREASE IN PRICE, THE QUANTITY SUPPLIED INCREASES BY THREE UNITS.

STEP 3: SET THE DEMAND EQUATION EQUAL TO THE SUPPLY EQUATION

TO FIND THE EQUILIBRIUM PRICE, SET THE DEMAND EQUATION EQUAL TO THE SUPPLY EQUATION:

$$100 - 2P = 20 + 3P$$

STEP 4: SOLVE FOR PRICE (P)

REARRANGING THE EQUATION YIELDS:

$$100 - 20 = 3P + 2P$$

$$80 = 5P$$

$$P = 16$$

STEP 5: CALCULATE EQUILIBRIUM QUANTITY

SUBSTITUTING THE EQUILIBRIUM PRICE BACK INTO EITHER THE DEMAND OR SUPPLY EQUATION GIVES THE EQUILIBRIUM QUANTITY. USING THE DEMAND EQUATION:

$$Q_D = 100 - 2(16) = 68$$

THUS, THE EQUILIBRIUM PRICE IS 16 AND THE EQUILIBRIUM QUANTITY IS 68.

FACTORS INFLUENCING EQUILIBRIUM PRICE

EQUILIBRIUM PRICE IS NOT STATIC; IT FLUCTUATES DUE TO SEVERAL EXTERNAL FACTORS. UNDERSTANDING THESE INFLUENCES IS CRUCIAL FOR PREDICTING MARKET CHANGES.

CHANGES IN DEMAND

WHEN CONSUMER PREFERENCES SHIFT OR INCOME LEVELS CHANGE, DEMAND CAN INCREASE OR DECREASE, LEADING TO A NEW EQUILIBRIUM PRICE. FOR INSTANCE:

- AN INCREASE IN CONSUMER INCOME MAY LEAD TO HIGHER DEMAND FOR LUXURY GOODS, RAISING THEIR EQUILIBRIUM PRICE.
- A CHANGE IN CONSUMER TASTES AWAY FROM A PRODUCT CAN LOWER DEMAND, RESULTING IN A DECREASED EQUILIBRIUM PRICE.

CHANGES IN SUPPLY

SUPPLY CAN ALSO BE AFFECTED BY VARIOUS FACTORS SUCH AS PRODUCTION COSTS OR THE NUMBER OF SUPPLIERS IN THE MARKET. FOR EXAMPLE:

- TECHNOLOGICAL ADVANCEMENTS CAN LOWER PRODUCTION COSTS, INCREASING SUPPLY AND POTENTIALLY LOWERING THE EQUILIBRIUM PRICE.
- A NATURAL DISASTER THAT AFFECTS PRODUCTION FACILITIES CAN DECREASE SUPPLY, RAISING THE EQUILIBRIUM PRICE.

REAL-WORLD APPLICATIONS OF EQUILIBRIUM PRICE

Q: WHAT HAPPENS IF THE MARKET PRICE IS BELOW EQUILIBRIUM PRICE?

A: IF THE MARKET PRICE IS BELOW THE EQUILIBRIUM PRICE, A SHORTAGE OCCURS AS QUANTITY DEMANDED EXCEEDS QUANTITY SUPPLIED, PROMPTING PRICES TO RISE UNTIL EQUILIBRIUM IS REACHED.

Q: CAN EQUILIBRIUM PRICE CHANGE OVER TIME?

A: YES, EQUILIBRIUM PRICE CAN CHANGE OVER TIME DUE TO SHIFTS IN SUPPLY AND DEMAND CAUSED BY FACTORS SUCH AS CONSUMER PREFERENCES, PRODUCTION COSTS, AND EXTERNAL ECONOMIC CONDITIONS.
