GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT (GDP)

UNEMPLOYMENT RATE

INFLATION RATE

CONSUMER PRICE INDEX (CPI)

SUPPLY AND DEMAND DYNAMICS

LAW OF SUPPLY

THE LAW OF SUPPLY POSITS THAT AN INCREASE IN THE PRICE OF A GOOD OR SERVICE WILL LEAD TO AN INCREASE IN THE QUANTITY SUPPLIED, ASSUMING OTHER FACTORS REMAIN CONSTANT. THIS PRINCIPLE HELPS EXPLAIN PRODUCER BEHAVIOR AND MARKET SUPPLY LEVELS.

MARKET EQUILIBRIUM

FISCAL POLICY AND GOVERNMENT SPENDING

FISCAL POLICY REFERS TO THE USE OF GOVERNMENT SPENDING AND TAXATION TO INFLUENCE THE ECONOMY. IT PLAYS A CRUCIAL ROLE IN MANAGING ECONOMIC FLUCTUATIONS AND PROMOTING STABILITY AND GROWTH.

COMPONENTS OF FISCAL POLICY

TOOLS OF MONETARY POLICY

CENTRAL BANKS UTILIZE SEVERAL TOOLS TO CONDUCT MONETARY POLICY, INCLUDING:
