

MEANING OF LABOR IN ECONOMICS

- **PROFESSIONAL LABOR:** THIS CATEGORY INCLUDES INDIVIDUALS WHO HAVE ADVANCED DEGREES AND PROVIDE SPECIALIZED SERVICES, SUCH AS LAWYERS, PROFESSORS, AND RESEARCHERS.

THE ROLE OF LABOR MARKETS

LEAD TO HIGHER PRODUCTIVITY LEVELS AMONG WORKERS.

LABOR IN ECONOMIC THEORIES
