HISTORICAL BACKGROUND OF MIDWEST ECONOMICS

THE INTRODUCTION OF ASSEMBLY LINE PRODUCTION BY HENRY FORD REVOLUTIONIZED MANUFACTURING PRACTICES AND POSITIONED THE MIDWEST AS A LEADER IN AUTOMOTIVE PRODUCTION.

THE ROLE OF TRANSPORTATION

TRANSPORTATION INFRASTRUCTURE HAS PLAYED A VITAL ROLE IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF MIDWEST ECONOMICS. THE ESTABLISHMENT OF RAILROADS IN THE 1800S FACILITATED THE MOVEMENT OF GOODS FROM RURAL AREAS TO URBAN CENTERS, ENHANCING TRADE AND COMMERCE.
