YIELD AND INTEREST RATES

THE YIELD ON TREASURY BONDS IS A CRITICAL FACTOR FOR INVESTORS AND THE ECONOMY. IT REFLECTS THE RETURN AN INVESTOR CAN EXPECT TO EARN IF THEY HOLD THE BOND UNTIL MATURITY.

UNDERSTANDING BOND YIELDS
