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UNDERSTANDING ECONOMIC BOOMS

CAUSES OF ECONOMIC BOOMS

FOLLOWING THE PEAK, THE ECONOMY MAY ENTER A PERIOD OF CONTRACTION. WHILE THIS IS NOT A FORMAL PART OF THE BOOM PHASE, IT IS ESSENTIAL TO RECOGNIZE THAT ECONOMIC CYCLES ARE INHERENTLY VOLATILE, AND A BOOM CAN QUICKLY TRANSITION INTO A RECESSION.

IMPACT OF ECONOMIC BOOMS
