Look for the complexity of the problems, the vocabulary used, and the mathematical topics covered.

Q: Should I focus on completing a certain number of problems on a worksheet, or on the quality of understanding?

A: The quality of understanding is paramount. While consistent practice is important, it's far more beneficial to ensure your child understands how to solve each problem and the underlying concepts, rather than just rushing to complete a large number of problems. Encourage them to explain their reasoning and don't move on until the concept is grasped.

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
