

WHO FOUND MATH

THE QUESTION OF WHO FOUND MATH IS A FASCINATING ONE, LEADING US ON A JOURNEY THROUGH MILLENNIA OF HUMAN THOUGHT AND DISCOVERY. IT'S NOT A SIMPLE ANSWER, AS MATHEMATICS WASN'T "FOUND" BY A SINGLE INDIVIDUAL BUT RATHER EVOLVED ORGANICALLY FROM HUMANITY'S INNATE NEED TO UNDERSTAND AND QUANTIFY THE WORLD AROUND US. THIS EXPLORATION WILL DELVE INTO THE EARLIEST ROOTS OF MATHEMATICAL CONCEPTS, TRACING THEIR DEVELOPMENT THROUGH ANCIENT CIVILIZATIONS, HIGHLIGHTING KEY FIGURES WHO SHAPED ITS TRAJECTORY, AND EXAMINING THE FUNDAMENTAL QUESTION OF WHETHER MATH IS A HUMAN INVENTION OR A DISCOVERY OF UNIVERSAL TRUTHS. WE'LL UNCOVER HOW EARLY HUMANS GRAPLED WITH COUNTING, GEOMETRY, AND ABSTRACT REASONING, LAYING THE GROUNDWORK FOR THE COMPLEX MATHEMATICAL SYSTEMS WE USE TODAY.

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THE ANCIENT ORIGINS OF MATHEMATICAL THOUGHT

TO UNDERSTAND WHO FOUND MATH, WE MUST FIRST ACKNOWLEDGE THAT IT DIDN'T SPRING INTO EXISTENCE FULLY FORMED. INSTEAD, MATHEMATICAL THINKING BEGAN AS A PRACTICAL NECESSITY FOR EARLY HUMANS. IMAGINE OUR PREHISTORIC ANCESTORS TRYING TO KEEP TRACK OF THEIR HUNTING GAME, THE CHANGING SEASONS, OR THE NUMBER OF PEOPLE IN THEIR TRIBE. THESE BASIC NEEDS FOR ENUMERATION AND COMPARISON ARE THE VERY SEEDS OF MATHEMATICS. THE EARLIEST EVIDENCE OF MATHEMATICAL THOUGHT COMES IN THE FORM OF TALLY MARKS ON BONES AND STONES, SUGGESTING A FUNDAMENTAL HUMAN DRIVE TO QUANTIFY AND RECORD QUANTITIES.

THIS INNATE HUMAN ABILITY TO RECOGNIZE PATTERNS, ORDER, AND QUANTITY IS THE BEDROCK UPON WHICH ALL SUBSEQUENT MATHEMATICAL DEVELOPMENT IS BUILT. IT'S ABOUT MORE THAN JUST COUNTING SHEEP; IT'S ABOUT THE LOGICAL CONNECTIONS BETWEEN NUMBERS, THE SPATIAL RELATIONSHIPS BETWEEN OBJECTS, AND THE ABSTRACT CONCEPTS THAT ALLOW US TO MODEL AND PREDICT PHENOMENA. THE RUDIMENTARY COUNTING SYSTEMS, THE RECOGNITION OF GEOMETRIC SHAPES IN NATURE (LIKE CIRCLES IN THE SUN OR TRIANGLES IN MOUNTAIN PEAKS), AND THE VERY CONCEPT OF "MORE" OR "LESS" ALL REPRESENT NASCENT MATHEMATICAL UNDERSTANDING.

EARLY CIVILIZATIONS AND THEIR MATHEMATICAL CONTRIBUTIONS

AS HUMAN SOCIETIES BECAME MORE COMPLEX, SO DID THEIR MATHEMATICAL NEEDS AND ACHIEVEMENTS. ANCIENT CIVILIZATIONS, DRIVEN BY THE DEMANDS OF AGRICULTURE, TRADE, CONSTRUCTION, AND ASTRONOMY, MADE MONUMENTAL LEAPS IN MATHEMATICAL UNDERSTANDING. THESE WERE NOT ISOLATED INDIVIDUALS WORKING IN LABORATORIES; RATHER, THESE DEVELOPMENTS OFTEN AROSE FROM PRACTICAL PROBLEMS FACED BY ENTIRE SOCIETIES.

MESOPOTAMIAN MATHEMATICS: THE CRADLE OF CALCULATION

THE SUMERIANS AND BABYLONIANS, RESIDING IN MESOPOTAMIA, ARE CREDITED WITH SOME OF THE EARLIEST SOPHISTICATED MATHEMATICAL SYSTEMS. THEY DEVELOPED A SEXAGESIMAL (BASE-60) NUMBER SYSTEM, WHICH IS STILL INFLUENTIAL TODAY IN OUR MEASUREMENT OF TIME (60 SECONDS IN A MINUTE, 60 MINUTES IN AN HOUR) AND ANGLES (360 DEGREES IN A CIRCLE). THEIR CUNEIFORM TABLETS REVEAL ADVANCED KNOWLEDGE OF ARITHMETIC, ALGEBRA, AND GEOMETRY. THEY COULD SOLVE LINEAR AND QUADRATIC EQUATIONS, CALCULATE AREAS AND VOLUMES, AND HAD A REMARKABLY ACCURATE UNDERSTANDING OF ASTRONOMY, WHICH REQUIRED SOPHISTICATED MATHEMATICAL TOOLS.

ANCIENT EGYPTIAN MATHEMATICS: PRACTICAL GEOMETRY AND ARITHMETIC

THE ANCIENT EGYPTIANS WERE MASTERS OF PRACTICAL MATHEMATICS, PARTICULARLY GEOMETRY, DRIVEN BY THEIR NEED TO SURVEY LAND AFTER THE ANNUAL NILE FLOODS AND CONSTRUCT MONUMENTAL ARCHITECTURE LIKE THE PYRAMIDS. THEIR HIEROGLYPHIC AND HIERATIC SCRIPTS SHOW EVIDENCE OF ARITHMETIC OPERATIONS, FRACTIONS, AND GEOMETRIC FORMULAS FOR AREAS AND VOLUMES. WHILE THEIR SYSTEM WAS PRIMARILY DECIMAL (BASE-10), IT WAS OFTEN LESS ABSTRACT THAN THE BABYLONIAN SYSTEM, FOCUSING HEAVILY ON PRACTICAL APPLICATIONS FOR LAND MEASUREMENT, CONSTRUCTION, AND ADMINISTRATION.

ANCIENT GREEK MATHEMATICS: THE DAWN OF PROOF AND ABSTRACTION

THE GREEKS ARE OFTEN LAUDED FOR TRANSFORMING MATHEMATICS FROM A PURELY PRACTICAL DISCIPLINE INTO A MORE ABSTRACT AND THEORETICAL ONE. THEY INTRODUCED THE CONCEPT OF DEDUCTIVE REASONING AND RIGOROUS PROOF, WHICH IS FOUNDATIONAL TO MODERN MATHEMATICS. FIGURES LIKE PYTHAGORAS, EUCLID, AND ARCHIMEDES ARE CENTRAL TO THIS REVOLUTION. WHILE THE QUESTION OF "WHO FOUND MATH" PREDATES THEM, THEY CERTAINLY DISCOVERED AND FORMALIZED MANY OF ITS MOST PROFOUND PRINCIPLES.

- **PYTHAGORAS:** THOUGH THE PYTHAGOREAN THEOREM IS NAMED AFTER HIM, THE CONCEPT OF THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE SIDES OF A RIGHT-ANGLED TRIANGLE WAS KNOWN TO EARLIER CIVILIZATIONS. PYTHAGORAS AND HIS FOLLOWERS, HOWEVER, ARE CREDITED WITH PROVIDING A MORE RIGOROUS MATHEMATICAL PROOF.
- **EUCLID:** HIS "ELEMENTS" IS ONE OF THE MOST INFLUENTIAL WORKS IN THE HISTORY OF MATHEMATICS, SYSTEMATICALLY PRESENTING GEOMETRIC THEOREMS AND PRINCIPLES USING AXIOMS AND POSTULATES. THIS ESTABLISHED A STANDARD FOR LOGICAL DEDUCTION THAT REMAINS A CORNERSTONE OF MATHEMATICAL EDUCATION.
- **ARCHIMEDES:** A BRILLIANT INVENTOR AND MATHEMATICIAN, ARCHIMEDES MADE SIGNIFICANT CONTRIBUTIONS TO GEOMETRY, CALCULUS (IN ITS NASCENT FORM), AND PHYSICS. HIS METHODS FOR CALCULATING AREAS AND VOLUMES OF IRREGULAR SHAPES FORESHADOWED LATER DEVELOPMENTS IN INTEGRAL CALCULUS.

INDIAN MATHEMATICS: INNOVATION IN NUMERALS AND ALGEBRA

ANCIENT INDIAN MATHEMATICIANS MADE GROUNDBREAKING CONTRIBUTIONS, PARTICULARLY IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE DECIMAL PLACE-VALUE SYSTEM, THE CONCEPT OF ZERO AS A NUMBER, AND ADVANCEMENTS IN ALGEBRA. BRAHMAGUPTA, IN THE 7TH CENTURY CE, ESTABLISHED RULES FOR OPERATING WITH ZERO AND NEGATIVE NUMBERS, A MONUMENTAL CONCEPTUAL LEAP. THE INDIAN NUMERAL SYSTEM, ADOPTED AND SPREAD BY THE ARABS, EVENTUALLY BECAME THE GLOBAL STANDARD, REVOLUTIONIZING CALCULATION.

CHINESE MATHEMATICS: EARLY ALGEBRA AND ALGORITHMS

ANCIENT CHINESE MATHEMATICS ALSO BOASTS IMPRESSIVE ACHIEVEMENTS. THEY DEVELOPED SOPHISTICATED METHODS FOR SOLVING SYSTEMS OF LINEAR EQUATIONS, EARLY FORMS OF MATRIX ALGEBRA, AND ALGORITHMS FOR CALCULATING SQUARE AND CUBE ROOTS. THEIR MATHEMATICAL TEXTS OFTEN FOCUSED ON PRACTICAL PROBLEMS RELATED TO ENGINEERING, SURVEYING, AND CALENDRIAL CALCULATIONS.

KEY FIGURES IN THE DISCOVERY AND DEVELOPMENT OF MATHEMATICS

WHILE MATH WASN'T "FOUND" BY ONE PERSON, CERTAIN INDIVIDUALS PLAYED PIVOTAL ROLES IN ITS DISCOVERY, FORMALIZATION, AND ADVANCEMENT ACROSS DIFFERENT ERAS. THESE BRILLIANT MINDS BUILT UPON THE WORK OF THEIR PREDECESSORS, PUSHING THE BOUNDARIES OF WHAT WAS KNOWN AND UNDERSTOOD. THEIR CONTRIBUTIONS ARE NOT ABOUT

"FINDING" MATH IN A PHYSICAL SENSE, BUT RATHER DISCOVERING ITS UNDERLYING LOGIC, STRUCTURE, AND POTENTIAL APPLICATIONS.

THE PREHISTORIC "FIRST COUNTER"

IT'S IMPOSSIBLE TO NAME A SPECIFIC INDIVIDUAL, BUT THE "DISCOVERY" OF COUNTING, THE MOST FUNDAMENTAL MATHEMATICAL CONCEPT, CAN BE ATTRIBUTED TO COUNTLESS UNNAMED INDIVIDUALS OVER TENS OF THOUSANDS OF YEARS. THESE WERE THE FIRST HUMANS WHO RECOGNIZED THE NEED TO QUANTIFY, TO SAY "ONE," "TWO," AND "MANY," LAYING THE VERY FIRST STONES IN THE FOUNDATION OF MATHEMATICS. THEIR METHODS LIKELY INVOLVED SIMPLE TALLYING USING FINGERS, STONES, OR MARKS ON BONE.

EUCLID: THE FATHER OF GEOMETRY

AS MENTIONED EARLIER, EUCLID, AROUND 300 BCE, DIDN'T "FIND" GEOMETRY, BUT HE SYSTEMATIZED AND ORGANIZED EXISTING KNOWLEDGE INTO A COHERENT, LOGICAL FRAMEWORK. HIS AXIOMATIC APPROACH, WHERE THEOREMS ARE DERIVED FROM BASIC ASSUMPTIONS, WAS REVOLUTIONARY AND ESTABLISHED A STANDARD FOR MATHEMATICAL RIGOR THAT HAS ENDURED FOR OVER TWO MILLENNIA. HIS WORK MADE THE DISCOVERY AND VERIFICATION OF GEOMETRIC TRUTHS ACCESSIBLE THROUGH REASON AND LOGIC.

PYTHAGORAS AND THE PYTHAGOREAN SCHOOL

THE FOLLOWERS OF PYTHAGORAS, A GREEK PHILOSOPHER AND MATHEMATICIAN FROM THE 6TH CENTURY BCE, ARE CREDITED WITH ADVANCING THE UNDERSTANDING OF NUMBER THEORY AND GEOMETRY. WHILE THE FAMOUS THEOREM BEARS HIS NAME, THE SCHOOL ITSELF IS THOUGHT TO HAVE MADE SIGNIFICANT CONTRIBUTIONS TO UNDERSTANDING THE PROPERTIES OF NUMBERS AND THEIR RELATIONSHIPS, EXPLORING CONCEPTS LIKE PRIME NUMBERS AND PERFECT NUMBERS. THEY SAW MATHEMATICS AS FUNDAMENTAL TO THE ORDER OF THE UNIVERSE.

AL-KHWARIZMI: THE ALGEBRAIST

MUHAMMAD IBN MUSA AL-KHWARIZMI, A PERSIAN MATHEMATICIAN WHO LIVED IN THE 9TH CENTURY CE, IS OFTEN CALLED THE "FATHER OF ALGEBRA." HIS SEMINAL WORK, "THE COMPENDIOUS BOOK ON CALCULATION BY COMPLETION AND BALANCING," INTRODUCED SYSTEMATIC METHODS FOR SOLVING LINEAR AND QUADRATIC EQUATIONS. THE TERM "ALGEBRA" ITSELF IS DERIVED FROM THE ARABIC WORD "AL-JABR" FROM THE TITLE OF HIS BOOK. HE ALSO PLAYED A CRUCIAL ROLE IN THE DISSEMINATION OF THE INDIAN NUMERAL SYSTEM TO THE WESTERN WORLD.

ISAAC NEWTON AND GOTTFRIED WILHELM LEIBNIZ: THE CALCULUS CO-INVENTORS

IN THE 17TH CENTURY, ISAAC NEWTON AND GOTTFRIED WILHELM LEIBNIZ INDEPENDENTLY DEVELOPED CALCULUS, A POWERFUL BRANCH OF MATHEMATICS THAT DEALS WITH RATES OF CHANGE AND ACCUMULATION. THIS WAS NOT A "DISCOVERY" OF A SINGLE MATHEMATICAL OBJECT BUT THE INVENTION OF A NEW MATHEMATICAL LANGUAGE AND TOOLKIT THAT REVOLUTIONIZED PHYSICS, ENGINEERING, AND MANY OTHER FIELDS. CALCULUS ALLOWED MATHEMATICIANS AND SCIENTISTS TO MODEL DYNAMIC SYSTEMS WITH UNPRECEDENTED ACCURACY.

IS MATHEMATICS DISCOVERED OR INVENTED?

THIS IS PERHAPS THE MOST PROFOUND QUESTION WHEN WE CONSIDER "WHO FOUND MATH." THERE ARE TWO PROMINENT PHILOSOPHICAL VIEWPOINTS ON THIS: PLATONISM AND FORMALISM, AMONG OTHERS. PLATONISM SUGGESTS THAT MATHEMATICAL TRUTHS EXIST INDEPENDENTLY OF HUMAN MINDS, MUCH LIKE ABSTRACT OBJECTS OR FORMS IN PLATO'S PHILOSOPHY. IN THIS VIEW, MATHEMATICIANS DON'T INVENT MATHEMATICS; THEY DISCOVER PRE-EXISTING TRUTHS ABOUT AN

ABSTRACT REALITY.

FROM A PLATONIC PERSPECTIVE, THE PYTHAGOREAN THEOREM, FOR EXAMPLE, WASN'T SOMETHING PYTHAGORAS "INVENTED." IT WAS A TRUTH THAT ALWAYS EXISTED, AND HE, THROUGH HIS INVESTIGATION, UNCOVERED IT. THE UNIVERSE, IN THIS VIEW, IS INHERENTLY MATHEMATICAL, AND OUR DISCOVERIES ARE SIMPLY PEELING BACK LAYERS OF THIS COSMIC ORDER TO REVEAL ITS UNDERLYING STRUCTURE. THIS PERSPECTIVE OFTEN ALIGNS WITH THE AWE AND WONDER THAT MATHEMATICIANS EXPRESS WHEN ENCOUNTERING ELEGANT MATHEMATICAL PROOFS AND RELATIONSHIPS.

ON THE OTHER HAND, FORMALISM VIEWS MATHEMATICS AS A SYSTEM OF SYMBOLS AND RULES THAT HUMANS CREATE. IT'S A GAME, AN ABSTRACT GAME PLAYED WITH LOGICAL RULES AND AXIOMS. IN THIS SENSE, MATHEMATICIANS INVENT THE SYSTEMS, THE LANGUAGES, AND THE STRUCTURES THROUGH WHICH THEY EXPLORE MATHEMATICAL CONCEPTS. WHILE THE UNDERLYING LOGIC MIGHT BE INHERENT, THE SPECIFIC FORMULATIONS, NOTATIONS, AND AXIOMS ARE HUMAN CONSTRUCTS. THIS VIEW EMPHASIZES THE CREATIVE AND CONSTRUCTIVE ASPECTS OF MATHEMATICS.

ULTIMATELY, THE DEBATE IS ONGOING AND PERHAPS UNRESOLVABLE. IT'S POSSIBLE THAT MATHEMATICS EXISTS IN A SPACE THAT IS BOTH DISCOVERED AND INVENTED. WE MIGHT DISCOVER FUNDAMENTAL LOGICAL TRUTHS AND RELATIONSHIPS INHERENT IN THE UNIVERSE, BUT WE INVENT THE LANGUAGE, NOTATION, AND SYSTEMS TO ARTICULATE, EXPLORE, AND APPLY THESE DISCOVERIES. THE JOURNEY OF UNDERSTANDING MATHEMATICS IS A TESTAMENT TO HUMAN INGENUITY, CURIOSITY, AND OUR PROFOUND CONNECTION TO THE PATTERNS AND ORDER THAT GOVERN EXISTENCE.

THE UNIVERSAL LANGUAGE OF NUMBERS

REGARDLESS OF WHETHER MATH IS SEEN AS DISCOVERED OR INVENTED, ITS UNIVERSAL NATURE IS UNDENIABLE. THE BASIC PRINCIPLES OF ARITHMETIC, GEOMETRY, AND LOGIC HOLD TRUE ACROSS CULTURES AND THROUGHOUT HISTORY. THE MATHEMATICAL RELATIONSHIPS THAT GOVERN THE MOVEMENT OF PLANETS ARE THE SAME IN ANCIENT GREECE, MODERN CHINA, OR ANY OTHER CORNER OF THE GLOBE. THIS UNIVERSALITY SUGGESTS A DEEPER, PERHAPS FUNDAMENTAL, ASPECT TO MATHEMATICAL TRUTHS, IRRESPECTIVE OF THE HUMAN MIND THAT APPREHENDS THEM.

THE EVOLVING NATURE OF MATHEMATICAL DISCOVERY

MATHEMATICS IS NOT A STATIC FIELD. NEW AREAS OF STUDY EMERGE, AND OLD ONES ARE REFINED AND EXPANDED UPON. THIS CONTINUOUS EVOLUTION FURTHER COMPLICATES THE IDEA OF A SINGLE "DISCOVERY." WHAT WE CONSIDER "MATH" TODAY IS VASTLY DIFFERENT FROM WHAT IT WAS FOR THE SUMERIANS OR EVEN EUCLID. THIS ONGOING DEVELOPMENT IMPLIES A DYNAMIC PROCESS OF BOTH UNCOVERING NEW TRUTHS AND CONSTRUCTING NEW FRAMEWORKS TO UNDERSTAND THEM. THE DISCOVERY OF CALCULUS BY NEWTON AND LEIBNIZ, FOR INSTANCE, DIDN'T REPLACE EARLIER MATHEMATICS BUT RATHER PROVIDED A POWERFUL NEW LENS THROUGH WHICH TO VIEW AND MANIPULATE EXISTING MATHEMATICAL IDEAS, AND TO DISCOVER ENTIRELY NEW ONES.

THE STORY OF "WHO FOUND MATH" IS A STORY OF HUMANITY ITSELF – OUR PERSISTENT QUEST TO UNDERSTAND, TO QUANTIFY, AND TO FIND ORDER IN THE UNIVERSE. IT'S A NARRATIVE OF COUNTLESS INDIVIDUALS, ACROSS DIVERSE CULTURES AND EPOCHS, CONTRIBUTING THEIR UNIQUE INSIGHTS TO A GRAND, EVER-EXPANDING TAPESTRY OF KNOWLEDGE. FROM THE EARLIEST TALLY MARKS TO THE MOST ABSTRACT THEORIES OF MODERN PHYSICS, THE HUMAN DRIVE TO ENGAGE WITH MATHEMATICAL CONCEPTS HAS SHAPED OUR WORLD AND OUR UNDERSTANDING OF IT.

Q: DID A SINGLE PERSON DISCOVER MATHEMATICS?

Q: WHICH ANCIENT CIVILIZATION MADE THE MOST SIGNIFICANT CONTRIBUTIONS TO EARLY MATH?

A: IT'S DIFFICULT TO SINGLE OUT ONE, BUT ANCIENT MESOPOTAMIA (SUMERIANS AND BABYLONIANS) DEVELOPED SOPHISTICATED NUMBER SYSTEMS (BASE-60) AND ALGEBRA, WHILE ANCIENT GREECE REVOLUTIONIZED MATHEMATICS WITH DEDUCTIVE REASONING AND PROOF, PARTICULARLY THROUGH FIGURES LIKE EUCLID. ANCIENT INDIA'S CONTRIBUTIONS WITH THE DECIMAL SYSTEM AND ZERO WERE ALSO MONUMENTAL.

Q: WHO IS CONSIDERED THE "FATHER OF ALGEBRA"?

A: MUHAMMAD IBN MUSA AL-KHWARIZMI, A 9TH-CENTURY PERSIAN MATHEMATICIAN, IS WIDELY CONSIDERED THE "FATHER OF ALGEBRA" DUE TO HIS SYSTEMATIC APPROACH TO SOLVING EQUATIONS AND THE INTRODUCTION OF THE TERM "ALGEBRA" ITSELF.

Q: WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN DISCOVERING AND INVENTING MATH?

A: THE QUESTION OF WHETHER MATH IS DISCOVERED OR INVENTED IS A PHILOSOPHICAL DEBATE. SOME BELIEVE MATHEMATICAL TRUTHS EXIST INDEPENDENTLY AND ARE DISCOVERED (PLATONISM), WHILE OTHERS ARGUE THAT HUMANS CREATE MATHEMATICAL SYSTEMS AND SYMBOLS (FORMALISM). IT'S LIKELY A COMBINATION, WITH FUNDAMENTAL PRINCIPLES BEING DISCOVERED AND THE FRAMEWORKS FOR UNDERSTANDING THEM BEING INVENTED.

Q: HOW DID THE ANCIENT GREEKS CONTRIBUTE TO MATHEMATICS?

A: THE ANCIENT GREEKS, PARTICULARLY FIGURES LIKE EUCLID AND PYTHAGORAS, TRANSFORMED MATHEMATICS BY INTRODUCING RIGOROUS PROOF, DEDUCTIVE REASONING, AND AXIOMATIC SYSTEMS. EUCLID'S "ELEMENTS" ESTABLISHED A MODEL FOR MATHEMATICAL LOGIC THAT HAS INFLUENCED WESTERN THOUGHT FOR MILLENNIA.

Q: WHAT WAS THE SIGNIFICANCE OF THE NUMBER ZERO IN MATHEMATICS?

A: THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE CONCEPT OF ZERO AS A NUMBER, ATTRIBUTED TO ANCIENT INDIAN MATHEMATICIANS LIKE BRAHMA GUPTA, WAS A REVOLUTIONARY STEP. IT ALLOWED FOR A CONSISTENT PLACE-VALUE SYSTEM, SIMPLIFIED CALCULATIONS, AND ENABLED THE DEVELOPMENT OF MORE ADVANCED ALGEBRA AND CALCULUS.

Q: IS MATHEMATICS A UNIVERSAL LANGUAGE?

A: YES, MATHEMATICS IS CONSIDERED A UNIVERSAL LANGUAGE BECAUSE ITS FUNDAMENTAL PRINCIPLES AND LOGIC ARE UNDERSTOOD AND APPLICABLE ACROSS CULTURES, LANGUAGES, AND TIME PERIODS. MATHEMATICAL TRUTHS DO NOT CHANGE BASED ON LOCATION OR SPOKEN TONGUE.

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
